Samasa refers to the process of compounding two or more words to form a single concise term. For 1st PUC students, mastering the identification and dissolution (Vigraha Vakya) of compounds is essential. The following technical categories are prioritized:

- Tatpurusha Samasa: The second member (Uttara-pada) is predominant. This is subdivided based on Vibhakti (case endings).
- Karmadharaya Samasa: A descriptive compound where one member acts as an adjective or comparison for the other.
- Dvandva Samasa: Both members are equally important (e.g., Rama-Lakshmanau).
- Bahuvrihi Samasa: The compound refers to a third entity not explicitly mentioned in the compound itself.
